4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of necessary measures

Inhalation (breathing)

6.2 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

For small amounts, wipe or absorb spill using inert material and dispose of according to local regulations. For large amounts, evacuate area and limit access. Prevent entry of material into sewage drains and confined areas. Dispose of any contaminated materials according to local regulations.

8.2 Exposure Controls

Appropriate engineering controls

Where the potential exists for exposure over 0.2 mg/m³: use a NIOSH approved full facepiece respirator with an acid gas cartridge specifically approved for sulfuric acid, with an R or P100 prefilter. Increased protection is obtained from full facepiece powered-air purifying respirators.

Where the potential exists for exposure over 2 mg/m³: use a NIOSH approved supplied-air respirator with a full facepiece operated in a pressure-demand or other positive-pressure mode. For increased protection use in combination with an auxiliary self-contained breathing apparatus operated in a pressure-demand or other positive-pressure mode.

Exposure to 15 mg/m³ is immediately dangerous to life and health. If the possibility of exposure above 15 mg/m³ exists, use a NIOSH approved self-contained breathing apparatus with a full facepiece operated in a pressure-demand or other positive-pressure mode equipped with an emergency escape air cylinder.

In case of emergency, entry into or escape from unknown concentrations, select the highest level approved respiratory protection available.

Incompatible materials

Sulfuric acid reacts violently with alcohol and water to release heat and will also react violently or explosively with organic materials; combustibles; strong bases (such as sodium hydroxide and potassium hydroxide); reducing agents (such as lithium, sodium, aluminum and their hydrides); and oxidizing agents (such as perchlorates, peroxides, permanganates, chlorates, nitrates, chlorine, bromine and fluorine). Sulfuric acid reacts with most metals to produce flammable and explosive hydrogen gas. Sulfuric acid is not compatible with strong acids (such as hydrochloric and nitric); moisture; amines; and many other substances.
